Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 9th, 2010, Shure Incorporated (“Shure”) met with Julius Knapp, Alan Stillwell, Bruce Romano, Karen Ansari and Hugh Van Tuyl of the Commission’s Office of Engineering and Technology to discuss ET Docket No. 04-186 and WT Docket Nos. 08-166 and 08-167. Attending this meeting on behalf of Shure were Mark Brunner, Senior Director, Global Public Relations, Edgar Reihl, Principal Engineer, and Catherine Wang of Bingham McCutchen LLP, outside counsel to Shure.

During this meeting Shure discussed several issues of critical importance to the wireless microphone community pending on reconsideration before the Commission in ET Docket No. 04-186. Shure reemphasized its belief in dynamic access and responsible frequency sharing, and expressed continued support for proven real-world technologies that advance these goals. Specifically:

- Shure discussed why spectrum sensing remains an important interference avoidance mechanism that complements geolocation database technology.
- Shure reemphasized why classifying sensitive wireless microphones as co-equal with Part 15 devices that tolerate significant interference is ***not*** a workable solution.
- Shure discussed a need for expanded wireless microphone license eligibility to include certain professional classes of user that may not qualify for a license under the current rules but that have similar use models and frequency interference expectations to current Part 74 licensees.

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- Shure urged the Commission to recognize the public interest value and highly varied use models of wireless microphones as it contemplates long-term changes in spectrum regulation.
- Shure addressed a number of other issues raised in its petition for reconsideration that help balance the need to protect wireless microphone incumbents while also making spectrum available for new TV Band Devices.
