My name is Sister Mary Scullion. I am a member of the order of the Sisters of Mercy and the co-founder, Executive Director and President of Project H.O.M.E. (Housing, Opportunities for Employment, Medical Care, Education). Our goal is to empower people to break the cycle of homelessness, address the structural causes of poverty, and help them attain their fullest potential as members of society.

From the beginning, Comcast believed in our vision-- that children, youth, adults and families can move towards greater prosperity by increasing their educational and employment opportunities through comprehensive technology and literacy instruction. As a result, the company has generously funded and supports The Honickman Learning Center and Comcast Technology Labs. This remarkable facility, located in largely poverty-stricken north central Philadelphia, provides resources for learning and job skills training to the community. Packed with advanced hardware and software systems, the Labs host programs for youth and adults, including after-school literacy instruction, technology classes, college and employment preparation and adult education. The Honickman Learning Center and Comcast Technology Labs is also the Philadelphia home of the Comcast Digital Connectors program. Run in conjunction with One Economy, the program
