Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 14, 2010, Paul Margie of Wiltshire & Grannis LLP, Paula Boyd and Paul Garnett of Microsoft, and Paul Lambert of Marvell Semiconductor met with John Peha, Chief Technologist.

The group discussed: (1) the technology industry's commitment to white spaces investment and innovation; (2) the benefits to consumers from white spaces technologies; (3) the group's support for limited Part 15 treatment of non-Part 74 wireless microphones and opposition to expansion of Part 74 eligibility; (4) that the FCC should, in considering pending petitions for reconsideration, allow either a geolocation/database or spectrum sensing solution to interference concerns (but not mandate the use of both), along with the equipment certification safeguards and reserved channels already in the FCC's order; (5) how further delay and/or over-restrictive rules would drive investment away from white spaces technology; and (6) how white spaces devices could use other frequencies in the TV band if the FCC were to re-pack the TV bands.
