Dear Chairman Genachowski and Commissioners:

I write in regard to Comcast's proposed joint venture with NBC-Universal. The National Hispanic Caucus of State Legislators (NHCSL) represents more than 300 Hispanic state legislators elected in over 25 states. NHCSL's mission is to promote policies that enhance quality of life for Hispanics and America. Our caucus supports the merger of Comcast and NBC-Universal, including acquisition of Telemundo, an important source of Spanish-language information and entertainment for Latinos across the country.

Investment in Telemundo is crucial to ensure its survival in an increasingly competitive media landscape. We are particularly encouraged that this transaction offers potential to increase resources for Telemundo under Comcast's leadership. Comcast's record of supporting diverse organizations is a key indicator of what we expect to be a beneficial environment for the growth of Telemundo and other NBC-Universal media outlets. NHCSL's leadership is committed to closely monitoring Comcast's management of Telemundo and its other properties following the transaction, and will offer our continued, honest and direct counsel to Comcast's leadership. We hope this partnership will extend a relationship of mutual benefit to Comcast and to Latino communities.

We are encouraged by Comcast's record of active engagement with the Latino community, and expect that record to expand with the new opportunities provided by this merger. Though Comcast has much work to do in increasing the diversity of its workforce and executive leadership, we remain confident in Comcast's long-term commitment to diversity. Our support today is offered with heightened expectations for Comcast to pursue ongoing advice and counsel from community leaders – with

particular focus on development of diverse programming for Latinos, sourcing programming from diverse suppliers, and promoting supplier and procurement diversity in general through this merger.

We expect Comcast to redouble its efforts to build a pipeline of diverse employees at every level of its organization, including its executive suite and Board of Directors. We also expect Comcast to grow its philanthropy. With new responsibilities to the communities served by this joint venture, Comcast must act with purpose to become an exemplar of diversity.

Please consider NHCSL's support of this merger, and our commitment to monitor and provide counsel to Comcast and NBC-Universal in ensuring that their commitments are redeemed.
