Dear Chairman Genachowski and Commissioners:

I am writing to communicate my support for Comcast and NBC's newly proposed partnership. Throughout the years, Comcast has consistently invested in local communities in New Jersey – particularly when it comes to advancing educational innovation. They provide free broadband and cable services to New Jersey public schools, teach our children about Internet safety, and produce informative educational programming such as Comcast Student Voices which they provide to requesting educational institutions at no charge. As the president of the New Jersey Parent Teachers Association (NJPTA), I have long been impressed by Comcast's support for New Jersey children and families.

The NJPTA is a volunteer organization of adults and students whose sole purpose is to advocate for children and youth interests.
