Motion for Extension of Time.

On June 17th, 2010, the full Commission in its public meeting adopted the referenced Notice of Inquiry, and set comment and reply comment filing deadlines.

Upon reviewing the documents released, it is apparent the time is too short to get an objective and full record on the issues put forth, and others that are emerging, in relation to the matter at hand.

The comment filing deadline was set for July 15, 2010, which is only 28 days from the adoption date, and most people did not see those document releases until June 18th, which leaves only 27 days to respond and file original comments in the Notice of Inquiry. That doesn't follow basic standards as outlined in 47 CFR 1 or other known 'best practices' regarding common filing timeframes for comments and reply comments.

Therefore, according to the rules outlined in 47 CFR 1, I move that the comment and reply comments deadline be moved forward to a later date, August 17th 2010 for filing initial comments, and September 17th 2010 for filing reply comments. As noted this should allow for a more complete record, and more so given there is a variety of breaking technology news in the broadband industry, especially the wireless broadband and associated matters within the CMRS (cellular telephone) industry, Some of this involves exactly what the NOI is in part about, consumer access to content and how much and where one can access the content and how and where that content is accessed and what devices can access and display it.
