I also recognize that Comcast does far more for Houston's students than just support Communities In Schools. The company has established a Digital Connectors site in partnership with the George I. Sanchez Charter School. Comcast is also providing free broadband services to many of the schools, libraries and civic centers in our area to ensure that our less fortunate students have access to the Internet and to learning critical digital literacy skills.




