As the Founder of Wood-to-Wonderful, a non-profit organization whose volunteers and grass roots initiatives make our community a better place to live, I'm writing to offer my support for Comcast and its proposed transaction with NBC Universal and to let you know about Comcast's outstanding commitment to the underserved children of Reading, Pennsylvania.

Comcast is dedicated to the children we serve—90% of whom live at or below the poverty level and are exposed to significant risk factors. Comcast provides philanthropic support to Wood-to-Wonderful, but the company also invests time and people to help further our mission. Thanks to Comcast's generous support and under the leadership of Comcast employee board members, Laura Entzminger, David Keen and Tina Rebholz, even more children have the opportunity to participate in Wood-to-Wonderful's programs.

As a church leader, there are many times when I stand up for what I believe is the right thing to do. I believe that Comcast’s proposed deal to join with NBC Universal is the right thing, so I am urging the FCC to give its approval.

There was a time, not long ago, when the African Americans you saw on television were stereotypes. Times have changed, and Comcast has helped make those changes. Comcast’s commitment to African American audiences is clearly seen in the many quality options being provided including TV One and the Africa Channel, which provides news and entertainment for the African American Community. Also, Comcast on Demand includes Black Entertainment Television (BET); H2OHip Hop, led by Russell Simmons; and QD3, founded by the great Quincy Jones III.

Moreover, Comcast provides a variety jobs with good salaries and benefits, including excellent health care and most importantly an opportunity to advance and develop a career in a growing industry.

Comcast has also helped many local non-profit organizations. For example, the Yancey Boys and Girls Club in the Englewood area of Chicago recently reopened. Those boys and girls are from poor families, and the Club provides a safe place to go in the afternoon where they can do their homework and have some fun, too. The building had been in really poor condition, but on Comcast Cares Day, about 150 Comcast volunteers helped clean up and repair the building. As you review the proposed transaction between Comcast and NBC Universal, we understand that you will be weighing many issues concerning telecommunications and media policy. We hope that you will also consider the public service records of these two companies, and how the proposed transaction will affect their commitment to philanthropy and good corporate citizenship. Based on Comcast's strong record of support for positive youth mentoring through Big Brothers Big Sisters, we feel confident that any new joint entity will continue this critical public service to youth across the country.

Big Brothers Big Sisters is the oldest, largest and most effective youth mentoring organization in the United States. We have been the leader in one-to-one youth service for more than a century, developing positive relationships that have a direct and lasting impact on the lives of young people. Big Brothers Big Sisters mentors children ages 6 through 18 in communities across the country, contributing to brighter futures, better schools, and stronger communities for all.

Comcast has not only contributed significantly to Big Brothers Big Sisters in telecommunications services and other donations; many in the company have volunteered their time as youth mentors. In 2008, the company launched the Comcast/Big Brothers Big Sisters Beyond School Walls program, pairing youth with Comcast employees for a visit at the Comcast Center in Philadelphia once every other week during the school year.



Often, women in troubling circumstances can fall between the cracks of agency services and fail to receive needed assistance. In Kankakee, Illinois, my organization -- The Rosie Fund -- exists to ensure that these women receive the help they need. Thanks to the support of Comcast and others, The Rosie Fund has provided textbooks for victims of domestic abuse, paid for transportation costs to and from the hospital for victims of rape or sexual assault, paid for locksmiths to change the home locks to protect families from their abusers and provided gas cards and telephone cards to help women with emergency travel and lodging expenses.

Without Comcast's commitment, these women would find it difficult, if not impossible, to overcome the adversities that life has thrown their way -- and we are very grateful for all it is helping The Rosie Fund accomplish.


