

I am writing with great humility and pride to tell the FCC about a life-changing effort in which I participated. As the State Senator from Michigan's 27th Senatorial District, and the founder of our state's disability caucus, I want to express my strong endorsement for the proposed joint venture between Comcast and NBC-Universal. I am sure you will understand my enthusiasm as you read this letter.

One of my constituents lived in the same home in Flint for 41 years. Her physical challenges have never stopped her from caring about the community. She is a long time block president whose dedicated work helped turn an abandoned building into the community park that now bears her name. But last year, it was she who needed help. I am proud to say Flint's Disability Network and Comcast answered that call.

This constituent and her daughter are both wheelchair dependent. Both her daughter's ability to visit and her mom's ability to leave her house were hampered by the lack of a wheelchair ramp at her home. I was humbled by the opportunity to join employee volunteers from Comcast and the Disability Network in building the ramp that finally made her home wheelchair accessible. As I told our local media


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at the time, this is what life is about—helping one person at a time achieve a better life.

And that's exactly what happened next. Comcast, which already supports numerous community organizations including the Boys and Girls Club of Flint, donated an additional \$30,000 to build and install five more wheelchair ramps for disabled residents. For people with disabilities, there is no greater gift than the gift of independence; there was no greater gift Comcast could have given.



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
