

As the FCC reviews the proposed transaction of Comcast and NBC Universal, I wanted to take this opportunity to urge your support of this endeavor and to inform you of Comcast's record here in the Township of Shaler, Pennsylvania, as a responsible corporate partner and jobs provider.

Shaler Township is a residential community with approximately 29,000 citizens, located minutes from downtown Pittsburgh. Comcast has been growing its business and adding jobs in Shaler and throughout western Pennsylvania.

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


