**RE: Nebraska Pub. Service Commission and Kansas Corp. Commission Petition for Declaratory Ruling or, in the Alternative, Adoption of Rule Declaring that State Universal Service Funds May Assess Nomadic VoIP Intrastate Revenues; WC Docket No. 06-122 (“Petition”)**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On June 28, 2010, representatives of the Nebraska Public Service Commission (“NPSC”) and the Kansas Corporation Commission (“KCC”) met with Priya Aiyar, Legal Advisor to Chairman Genachowski. The NPSC and KCC were represented by Elisabeth H. Ross and James H. Lister of this firm. Shana Knutson, Counsel to the NPSC, also participated in the discussion telephonically, as did Patrice Petersen-Klein, Advisory Counsel to the KCC. Mike Hybl, the NPSC’s Executive Director and General Counsel, and Sue Vanicek, Director of the Nebraska Universal Service Fund Department, also attended telephonically.

The NPSC/KCC representatives re-iterated in the meeting the points made in their above-referenced Petition, their reply comments, and their prior ex parte presentations, and urged that the Commission grant their Petition so that nomadic VOIP providers contribute to federal and state universal service funds on 100% of their revenues as their circuit-switched, wireless, and fixed VOIP competitors already do.
