Dear Ms. Dortch,

On Thursday, July 1, John Morris and David Sohn of the Center for Democracy and Technology (CDT) met with Edward Lazarus, Chief of Staff to Chairman Genachowski. We discussed the issues raised in the Open Internet proceeding, including:

- the importance of transparency for both consumers and applications providers;
- the principle of nondiscrimination
- the concept of "reasonable network management," including how or when "quality of service" practices should be considered reasonable;
- a category of "managed or specialized services" that could be exempt from any nondiscrimination requirements;
- the extent to which wireless broadband services should be subject to open Internet rules;
- how the FCC might proceed in light of the D.C. Circuit's recent decision in the *Comcast* case and current interest in Congress.

The views CDT expressed on all these matters are consistent with and reflected in CDT's publicly filed comments and reply comments in the Open Internet proceeding.
