Dear Ms. Dortch:

Nearly two years ago, the Association of Public-Safety Communications Officials-International (“APCO”), the National Emergency Number Association (“NENA”), and AT&T Wireless submitted a proposal for E9-1-1 location accuracy rules for wireless providers using network-based location technologies.

On June 16, 2010, T-Mobile submitted a letter to the Commission in which it indicates that it now accepts the requirements of the joint APCO, NENA and AT&T proposal, albeit with certain modifications set forth in its letter.

APCO and NENA believe that there should be no further delay in the resolution of this important public safety issue. Therefore, we do not object to T-Mobile’s proposed modifications, and we strongly urge the Commission to proceed expeditiously to adopt the necessary orders to implement the modified proposal.
