Dear Chairman and Commissioners:

I write from South Bend, Indiana, an area that is torn between economic prosperity and poverty, where Hoosiers work together to provide for those in need, and where Comcast has shown itself to be a committed, generous force for good.

The Center for the Homeless, the organization I direct, is a 200 bed residential resource facility for homeless men, women, and children. In this area of great need, we provide life-changing services to each person who walks in our doors. In fact, since May, we have seen three families and 11 individuals move into permanent housing, 21 people find employment, and eight individuals celebrate major milestones in sobriety. 13 people are preparing to start classes at area colleges this year.

To provide these necessary services, we rely on strong community support, like that of our long-time partner, Comcast. Not only has Comcast provided its great services to our organization over the years at a great rate and donated much needed items, it has shown itself as a strong force of good as 349 volunteers came to transform our space on Comcast Cares Day, April 24, 2010. Volunteers worked on the renovation of our new Robert L. Miller, Sr. Veteran's Center, a 25 bed facility for homeless veterans. They donated and spread playground-grade mulch in the play area for our free, on-site Montessori Academy. Positive and enthusiastic painters from Comcast gave much of our building a fresh coat of paint. Comcast transformed our space in one day, and helped us continue to transform lives.

I hope you will consider this testimony in favor of Comcast and its strong sense of involvement in American communities and service to those who need it most. Comcast is a true partner in the important work that we do.
