Dear Commission Chairman Genachowski:

I write in support Comcast's proposal to join with NBC Universal and do hereby encourage the Federal Communications Commission to approve the proposed partnership between these two entities.

I am the Founder and Director of *The Susquehanna River School*; a novel floating classroom educational program designed to teach area youth (and adults) about the vast History and many Natural Wonders associated with the Susquehanna River. I developed this program as part of the Harrisburg Area Riverboat Society, Inc., a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization which owns and operates, as a community service, *The Pride of the Susquehanna* riverboat at Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. Our novel program utilizes the 100 ton riverboat as our *floating classroom* as we teach area children and adults about the value and importance of our great Susquehanna; the single largest tributary flowing into the Chesapeake Bay. Many consider our novel program to be a valued means for successfully teaching good stewardship of our river and The Bay.

Comcast has been a wonderful supporter of *The Pride of the Susquehanna* since its initial launch in 1988. More recently however, Comcast has become a great supporter of our River School educational program. With the support of Comcast, we have been able to expand our floating classroom educational offerings to inner-city children in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. Both the City of Harrisburg and the City's school district have become distressed and we believe their situation makes it all the more important and constructive for community service organizations like the Riverboat Society to *partner* with entities like Comcast in support of the difficult educational challenges faced by inner-city school students.

As a result of our *partnership* with Comcast, we have recently been able to create a very special *new* program custom-designed *only* for the Harrisburg School District; *The River Guides Program*. This program will be offered this Fall to selected promising students who will be given advanced River School classes followed with professionally created *leadership training*. We will then provide these students with training in video production (to have them involved in the making of educational videos related to the Susquehanna) and we hope next year to have some of these

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students *work* as River Guides (assistant instructors) on our vessel and at a River School Educational Park we hope to build on an island in the Susquehanna.

I believe it is important for the Commission to know and understand that our creation of the *River Guides* program was not merely something we developed and proposed to Comcast and then hoped Comcast would fund. To the contrary, our creation of the *River Guides* program was a "collaborative effort" with local Comcast officials wherein Comcast representatives were directly involved in the creative process from the start. And, Comcast was instrumental in making sure our River Guides Program included the specialized "*leadership*" training for the selected students. I regard this special effort on the part of Comcast to be reflective of *higher standards of community interest and investment.* Comcast wanted our program to do MORE.


Having myself worked in the U.S. Congress and U.S. Senate as a Chief of Staff several years ago, I am well-aware of the daunting challenges brought before the FCC. I know your requests for Public Comment are both serious and sincere.

This is the first time I have communicated with the FCC as a private citizen or as someone writing in support of a proposal such as *partnership* between Comcast and NBC Universal. If I thought it would be more effective in adding *weight* to my letter in support of the Comcast/NBC partnership... I would have enclosed a brick! Instead, I will simply invite you and your fellow Commissioners to reflect on the fact that a powerful national business entity like Comcast has clearly shown itself to be ready and willing to form "*partnerships*" with other organizations to help better our communities and our schools. To many, they have already shown their *partnership* skills, abilities and intentions in good and positive ways

Again, I urge the Commission to approve the Comcast/NBC partnership proposal.




Dear Chairman Genachowski:
