As a retired Regional President for Alcoa and a current state senator in South Carolina, I know what it takes to make a business successful, and I know the importance of successful businesses that are committed to their communities. Based on that expertise, I am writing to encourage you to approve Comcast's proposed partnership with NBC Universal.

I recently attended a check presentation at which Comcast awarded a \$10,000 grant to provide funding for the Reach Out and Read program at the Franklin C. Fetter Family Health Center. Reach Out and Read promotes early literacy and school readiness in pediatric exam rooms nationwide by giving new books to children and advice to parents about the importance of reading aloud. This is just one example of Comcast's service to our local communities. Throughout South Carolina, Comcast provides courtesy service to libraries, municipalities and schools, and its direct charitable giving now totals hundreds of thousands of dollars in our state.


Much of my career, in corporate America and in the South Carolina Senate, has been focused on improving the quality of life for the people of this state. Whether serving on



I am writing to you today on behalf of the Broward College Foundation to share our gratitude for Comcast's dedication to our college, located in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. We would not be able to accomplish our mission without the generosity of partners like Comcast.

The Foundation awards more than \$2 million in scholarships annually to Broward College students, and supports academic programs and awards for outstanding faculty. Our grants provide financial aid to more than 50 percent of the Broward student population, students who would not otherwise be able to attend college. The State of Florida only funds 48 percent of Broward College's cost of doing business; the balance must be made up through additional support from committed individuals and the private sector.

Comcast uses its array of communications technologies to help spread the word about our Foundation and the many opportunities Broward College offers students and members of the local community. In particular, Comcast's public service announcements and "Newsmakers" segments have been a crucial piece of our outreach efforts and remain a highly effective vehicle for promoting higher education among segments of the population who might not otherwise view college as an affordable option.


