During this period of public comment, I wish to express my opinion & concerns about the possible sale of NBC to Comcast.

The NBC outlet in the Seattle area is KING5. Since November of 2009 its signal has become progressively weaker & less reliable (see enclosed cc).

I read that the FCC has placed a condition on the possible sale of NBC to Comcast that they may not weaken the signals of the NBC affiliates after the purchase.

Perhaps the KING5 situation described in the cc is an isolated case; but, if this is widespread, signals of NBC affiliates will have already been weakened before the sale to Comcast is made.

In my opinion this sale would constitute a conflict of interest.

Dear Mr. Heacox:

The purpose of this letter is to comment on the deteriorating quality of KING 5's HDTV broadcast signal.

Since this house was built in 1973, we always got excellent analogue television reception on most stations because the house is located near the west side of Puget Sound, & there are no geographic or man-made barriers between my antenna & the broadcast towers, blocking the signal.


When the nation converted to HD TV in 2009, the signals from various stations came in with different degrees of reliability. The most dependable signals came from KCTS 90 (99.9%); KING 5 (96%); & KSTW 11 (95%). Since November 2009, KING 5's signal has been regressively less & less reliable (60%).

I do not wish to have cable or satellite service because: what is available from broadcast TV is plenty of programming for me; according to what I learned in 7TH grade civics class the airwaves belong to the people & I do not wish to pay for a signal that is already legally mine; & I am a senior citizen who lives by himself & can barely make ends meet without cable. My total income is Social Security & a small monthly annuity.

If there were a barrier between the point of broadcast & I couldn't receive the signals with my antenna, I would understand & use other means to receive entertainment, information & education, however, that is not the case in my situation. Analogue television reception was always excellent here & the only thing that has changed is the method of broadcasting.

I wonder if you are aware of the deteriorating quality of KING5's signal & what is being done to correct the situation?
