

I. Introduction

On May 25, 2010, Cellco Partnership d/b/a Verizon Wireless (“Verizon Wireless”) submitted a response to the information requested in the November 19, 2009 letter from Ruth Milkman, Chief of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, and the attached General Information Request, also dated November 19, 2009. This submission supplements that May 25th response by providing copy of the Transition Services Agreement in response to Question II.5. as well as a revised response to Question III.3.¹

This supplement contains material that is extremely sensitive, from a commercial, competitive and financial perspective, that Verizon Wireless would not, in the normal course of its business, reveal to the public or its competitors. Where appropriate, therefore, much material is being submitted on a confidential basis pursuant to the First Protective Order and Second Protective Order in this proceeding.² The highly confidential, unredacted submission is marked “*HIGHLY CONFIDENTIAL*”

Consistent with the First Protective Order and Second Protective Order, Verizon Wireless expects prompt notification of any “Acknowledgment of Confidentiality” submitted by any person seeking access to the confidential, unredacted material. Verizon Wireless also requests the return of all confidential material at the conclusion of this proceeding.

II. Questions Regarding Divestiture GSM Network To Be Acquired

On page 8 of the Public Interest Statement in the Application, the Applicants state that Verizon Wireless will be acquiring the Divestiture GSM Network and that Verizon Wireless will integrate that network into its pre-existing CDMA PCS network. The Applicants also state that Verizon Wireless will collocate CDMA equipment ("GSM/CDMA overlay") on many of the existing towers, while continuing to operate the Divestiture GSM Network "for a period of time to permit a smooth customer migration to the CDMA network."

The current roaming contracts between Centennial and other GSM carriers are not being assigned to Verizon Wireless as part of this transaction, and Verizon Wireless does not have visibility into those confidential contracts.
