Dear Ms. Dortch:

On July 20, 2010, Randall Stephenson, Chairman, Chief Executive Officer and President of AT&T Inc., met with Chairman Julius Genachowski. At the meeting, Mr. Stephenson expressed AT&T's strong opposition to the Commission's proposal to reclassify broadband Internet access as a Title II common carrier service. Consistent with AT&T's comments in the reclassification proceeding, Mr. Stephenson emphasized that the proposal would create significant regulatory uncertainty that would undermine investment in broadband networks. Mr. Stephenson committed to work with Chairman Genachowski on alternative approaches that would enable the Commission to pursue the goals of the National Broadband Plan.

Mr. Stephenson also discussed the Commission's proposal to mandate data roaming. Consistent with AT&T's comments in the data roaming docket, Mr. Stephenson pointed out that the Commission lacks authority to implement that mandate.
