

Prior to my election to the Senate, I served 18 years on the City Council in Charleston, a community served by Comcast. As the Executive Director of Crime Stoppers in Houston, Texas, I have had the opportunity to work with Comcast since 2007. I would like to share my positive opinion of the company in the hope that this knowledge will aid your deliberations on its proposal to join with NBC Universal.

Crime Stoppers of Houston's mission is to solve and prevent serious crime in the Greater Houston area in partnership with citizens, media and the criminal justice system. We operate 713-222-TIPS, a telephone tip line where information about criminal activity is received and transferred to law enforcement for immediate action. In 2009, there were 825 felons arrested, 970 crimes solved, and we awarded \$793,100 to those who provided tips.

It is easy to see that our partnership with local media is crucial; the more people we reach, the more likely we can solve a crime. Every month Comcast features Houston's most wanted via its On Demand Police Blotter. In fact, we honored Comcast with our Leon Goldstein Award just last year for supporting our efforts with this mechanism. It has helped us catch countless criminals and solve crimes.

Comcast also provides public service announcements on our behalf and interview opportunities on the Newsmakers program. I am certain this exposure has been crucial to our success in apprehending criminal offenders.

Comcast is helping to make Houston a safer place for residents and visitors alike. In light of our overwhelmingly positive experience, Crime Stoppers is in full favor of Comcast's joint partnership with NBC Universal.




**The Lunch Club is generously funded by Comcast. While the financial support is invaluable to us, what's really significant is how closely the company's philanthropic efforts align with our mission.**

As the State Senator from Michigan's 27<sup>th</sup> Senatorial District, and the founder of our state's disability caucus, I want to express my strong endorsement for the proposed joint venture between Comcast and NBC-Universal. One of my constituents lived in the same home in Flint for 41 years. Her physical challenges have never stopped her from caring about the community. This constituent and her daughter are both wheelchair dependent. 


at the time, this is what life is about—helping one person at a time achieve a better life.

As a veteran of nonprofit community life in southwest Michigan, I would like to express my support for the Comcast-NBC merger. During the 1990's and the first six years of the new century, I served as Executive Director of the Volunteer Center of Southwest Michigan and, in that capacity, had many opportunities to see the benefits that Comcast brought, not only to my own organization, but also to the greater southwest Michigan community.

As marketing dollars are very scarce for local nonprofits, Comcast stepped forward for as many as 75 local agencies to offer Newsmakers taping of promotional television interviews with staff members of those organizations. From personal experience, I can tell you that many people viewed the Volunteer Center's piece on Newsmakers each day that we appeared – and it was often. The resulting higher profile of our organization and its critical services to the community went a long way in communicating our mission in this region – something we never could have afforded by ourselves.

Also in my capacity at the Volunteer Center, I was able to suggest project ideas to Comcast when requested by their Manager of Corporate and Government Affairs. The office frequently sought out new ideas and new ways to serve southwest Michigan in a variety of ways. Over the years, Comcast has provided its staff members who volunteered to help with a wide variety of projects from helping at the Berrien County Historical Association's 1839 Courthouse Square to helping to remodel and reorganize the Benton Harbor/Benton Township Senior Center so that it was more readily usable by the senior citizens in the Benton Harbor area. 




