Free Press submits this notice in compliance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's rules.

On July 29, 2010, I spoke with Joshua Cinelli, Media Advisor to Commissioner Michael Copps. We discussed the Commission's pending review of the Comcast/NBCU merger application. I explained that the deal would adversely impact competition in the MVPD, independent programming, local broadcast, and nascent online video markets, and expressed doubt that conditions would be effective in remedying all of the anticompetitive harms resulting from the merger. I stressed that the merger applicants have failed to demonstrate that the proposed transaction meets the public interest standard mandated by the Communications Act, and that the public interest commitments offered by Comcast and NBCU are not sufficient to balance out the negative repercussions of the merger.
