Dear Ms. Dortch:

On August 3, 2010, Kerry Murray of Dell Inc., Richard Whitt of Google Inc., and Edmond Thomas, Paul Margie, and Rob Carter of Wiltshire & Grannis LLP met with Commissioner McDowell's Legal Advisor Angela Giancarlo. During this meeting, the parties discussed several points made in a recent ex parte letter filed by 19 companies and organizations in support of the Commission's efforts to move forward on resolving the petitions for reconsideration of the white spaces order.¹ Specifically, Dell and Google highlighted the benefits of access to unlicensed spectrum below 1 GHz and reiterated their support for the white spaces. The companies also stressed the importance of establishing favorable final rules for white space operations, including eliminating the sensing requirement for devices that use geolocation, reducing the size of "keep out" zones for Part 74 wireless microphones, and treating unauthorized wireless microphones as Part 15 devices rather than broadcast licensees.
