**APPLICANT'S FIRST REQUEST FOR PRODUCTION OF DOCUMENTS
AND THINGS FOR INSPECTION, COPYING AND PHOTOGRAPHING
TO F.C.C. ENFORCEMENT BUREAU
[47 C.F.R., Part I, Subpart B, §1.325(a)]**

Pursuant to Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1, Subpart B, 1.325(a), Applicant-licensee WILLIAM F. CROWELL hereby requests that the Enforcement Bureau of the Federal Communications Commission (hereinafter "the Bureau") produce, within 10 days of the date hereof, copies of the following documents and letters which constitute or contain evidence within the scope of examination permitted by Title 47 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 1, Subpart B, 1.311(b), and which are in the possession, custody or control of the Bureau:

1. The email dated November 6, 2002 from Riley Hollingsworth to Ben Gardner, holder of amateur callsign KD7BCW, in which Hollingsworth stated, inter alia, “Ben – I never read email from Crowell anyway. It is auto deleted from my computer and I don’t even know that it comes in.”

2. The email dated January 14, 2003 from Riley Hollingsworth to Ben Gardner, holder of amateur callsign KD7BCW, in which Hollingsworth stated, inter alia, “Ben, the guy is a dickhead. You just have to stop talking to him”.

3. The email, date unknown, from Riley Hollingsworth to Jerry W. Oxindine, holder of amateur callsign K4KWH, in which Hollingsworth told Oxindine, essentially, that amateur radio operators should deliberately transmit one-way transmissions over unlicensed intruders into the 10-meter amateur band; that such transmissions by amateur operators would be legal because unlicensed stations have no rights and there is no obligation to recognize them in any way; and that such unlicensed stations would have no legal basis to complain to the Commission because they have no legal standing; i.e., they don’t exist.

4. The email, dated on or about February 13, 2001, from Riley Hollingsworth to Orville Dalton, holder of amateur callsign K6UEY, in which Hollingsworth informed Dalton, essentially, that the recordings of Applicant that Dalton had previously furnished to Hollingsworth were legally and factually insufficient to prove intentional interference by Applicant because the other stations in the roundtable QSO desired to, and did, speak to Applicant, and that Dalton should instead request Applicant to leave the QSO when he first appeared on frequency, and that Dalton should tell the other participants in the QSO to remain silent when Applicant appeared on frequency in order to make it appear that Applicant was

engaging in one-way transmissions or intentional interference.

5. The email, date and name of recipient unknown, from Riley Hollingsworth to a licensed radio amateur, in which Hollingsworth informed the recipient, essentially, that the recordings of Applicant that the recipient had previously furnished to Hollingsworth were legally and factually insufficient to prove intentional interference by Applicant because the other stations in the roundtable QSO desired to, and did, speak to him, and that the recipient should advise the other participants in the QSO to deliberately transmit when Applicant identified his station so that Hollingsworth could claim that Applicant was deliberately interfering with their transmissions under the guise of properly identifying his station.

6. A copy of the interview of Riley Hollingsworth in the August, 2007 issue of "CQ" magazine, in which Hollingsworth stated, inter alia, "We are not the greatest nation on earth. We think we are but we aren't, and we aren't the greatest people. Look at the evening news for about a week of you don't realize that. And think about what the rest of the world sees going on in America. What we are is this: We are rude, self-important, cell-phone yapping, road raging and stressed out monsters behind the wheel. And all too often behind the microphone. You are increasingly calling upon the FCC too much to solve your problems."


