Dear Ms. Dortch:

Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Commission Rules, this notice of an ex parte presentation in the above-referenced matter is being provided. On August 5, 2010, the undersigned, with representatives of Educational Media Foundation (“EMF”) and Prometheus Radio Project (“Prometheus”), met with Eloise Gore, Acting Media Legal Advisor, Office of Commissioner Mignon Clyburn to discuss the Memorandum of Agreement (“MOA”) between EMF and Prometheus filed with the FCC on July 8, 2010 in connection with the above-referenced matter. The topics covered in the meeting included the motivations of the parties in deciding to enter into the agreement, questions about other parties who did not sign the agreement who might be affected by its implementation, and issues as to whether the agreement would effectuate announced goals of the FCC in actions taken earlier in this proceeding.

Additionally, EMF and Prometheus stated that the MOA would fulfill the Commission’s goals of localism by allowing local groups to apply for stations in urban areas, while also allowing rural communities to gain service via translators. The parties noted also that the MOA could resolve some of the questions raised regarding priorities between LPFMs and translators.


