

I expect the FCC to aggressively act to maintain net neutrality. A lot of the internet sites I use are low traffic websites that aren't big revenue generators. Only the FCC can stop these guys from acting like monopolies, ripping off the public because of their sheer size. Let's keep the internet an equal opportunity provider.
