Cordia Communications Corp., My Tel Co, Inc. and Northstar Telecom, Inc.

Dear Secretary Dortch,

Please allow this correspondence to serve as notification that Cordia Communications Corp. (“Cordia”), My Tel Co, Inc. (“MyTel”), and Northstar Telecom, Inc. (“Northstar”), are all non-facilities based competitive local exchange carriers and subsidiaries of parent Cordia Corporation, are not able to comply with the above captioned federal regulation. The Companies’ telemarketing representatives are not able to drop off solicitation calls one the Third Party Verification has been initiated. For the following reasons, we request an exemption to the Commission mandate.

Compliance with the requirement is infeasible for our company, as we lack the technical means to allow our representatives to drop off the call once the verification has begun. Currently our representative stays on the line with his or her phone on mute and does not interact in any way with the customer. Furthermore, the equipment upgrades that would be required to comply with the Commission’s mandate are economically prohibitive. As a small competitive carrier, we lack the resources of a larger incumbent provider and are not able to upgrade our equipment as often as a larger carrier. Compliance with the mandate would put an immense burden on our financial well-being.

For the above reason we respectfully request that the Commission grant Cordia, MyTel and Northstar an exemption from the “drop-off” requirement in 47 C.F.R. § 64.1120(c)(3)(ii)
