On August 17, 2010, Qwest Corporation (Qwest) filed a letter that withdrew its four forbearance petitions¹ filed in the above-captioned matter pursuant to Section 10 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended,² seeking certain forbearance relief in specific areas in the Denver, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Phoenix and Seattle Metropolitan Statistical Areas.

This Erratum attaches a new letter that provides additional clarification concerning the withdrawal of the petitions and its lack of any impact on a pending appeal brought by Qwest in the Tenth Circuit Court of Appeals of a separately docketed forbearance petition involving only

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Qwest Corporation respectfully withdraws the four forbearance petitions¹ filed in the above-captioned matter pursuant to Section 10 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended,² seeking certain forbearance relief in specific areas in the Denver, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Phoenix and Seattle Metropolitan Statistical Areas. This withdrawal only applies to the four petitions filed on April 27, 2007 and does not apply to the forbearance petition Qwest filed for the Phoenix MSA on March 24, 2009.³ This withdrawal therefore has no effect on Qwest's pending
