On September 8, 2010, Kerry Murray of Dell Inc., Paula Boyd of Microsoft Corp., and Edmond Thomas, Paul Margie, and Rob Carter of Wiltshire & Grannis LLP met with Commissioner Clyburn's Legal Advisor Louis Peraertz. In addition, Mr. Thomas met with Julius Knapp, Alan Stillwell, Ira Keltz, Walter Johnston, Geraldine Matise, and Bruce Romano of the Office of Engineering and Technology.

During these meetings, the parties discussed Dell and Microsoft's support for white spaces, and their appreciation that the Commission is moving forward to establish final rules for white space operations. The companies also reviewed several points previously made in recent ex parte letters filed by Dell and Microsoft, including the importance of removing the sensing requirement for geolocation-enabled white space devices, reducing the size of "keep out" zones for Part 74 wireless microphones, and treating unauthorized wireless microphones as Part 15 devices rather than broadcast licensees.
