Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 10, 2010, Paula Boyd of Microsoft Corp. and Edmond Thomas, Paul Margie, and Rob Carter of Wiltshire & Grannis LLP on behalf of Dell Inc. and Microsoft met with Commissioner Clyburn's Legal Advisors Eloise Gore and Louis Peraertz to discuss the television white spaces proceeding. During this meeting, Dell and Microsoft highlighted the benefits of unlicensed access to the white spaces, described a typical network setup involving both "Mode I" and "Mode II" white space operations, and discussed restrictions on Mode I devices recently proposed by the Association for Maximum Service Television. In addition, we discussed the importance of removing the sensing requirement for geolocation-enabled white space devices, reducing the size of "keep out" zones for Part 74 wireless microphones, and treating unauthorized wireless microphones as Part 15 devices rather than broadcast licensees.
