AT&T Inc., on behalf of its affiliates, ("AT&T") provides the following status report as required by the Order and Request For Further Comment in the above referenced matter adopted by the International Bureau on June 15, 2009.¹

AT&T's circuits formerly used to terminate traffic with the Tonga Communications Corporation ("TCC") remain disrupted at this time. Following the announcement by Tonga's Ministry of Information and Communications on June 9, 2010 that its minimum rate requirement for inbound international calls has been abolished effective from April 1, 2010, AT&T hopes that it will soon be able to resume directly routed services to Tonga.
