Re: Corrections to *Ex Parte* Presentation Letters filed in MB Docket Nos. 10-25, 10-56, 10-103; GN Docket No. 09-191; and WC Docket No. 07-52

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 15, 2010, National Hispanic Media Coalition (NHMC) filed a notice of *ex parte* presentation in MB Docket numbers 10-25 and 10-51. That notice was inadvertently and incorrectly labeled as a “comment” as opposed to an *ex parte* presentation, and was mistakenly filed in MB Docket 10-51 instead of MB Docket 10-56.

On September 16, 2010, NHMC filed another notice of *ex parte* presentation in MB Docket numbers 10-25, 10-51, and 10-103, as well as GN Docket number 09-51 and WC Docket number 07-52. Again, that notice was inadvertently and incorrectly labeled as a “comment” as opposed to an *ex parte* presentation, and was mistakenly filed in MB Docket number 10-51 instead of 10-56.

Upon discovering these errors, NHMC promptly called the Secretary’s office and requested that the letters be deleted from MB Docket number 10-51. NHMC advised the office that it would amend the *ex parte* notices and file those amendments in the appropriate dockets. NHMC hereby amends and corrects those mistakes, with details of the *ex parte* presentations described below.

First, on September 14, 2010, Alex Nogales, Brenda Castillo, Jessica Gonzalez and Brenda Rivas from NHMC met with Commissioner Michael Copps and his media advisor, Joshua Cinelli.

Mr. Nogales expressed grave concern about hate speech in media and its correlation to hate crimes against Latinos, and explained how hate speech and hate crimes against Latinos have intensified since NHMC filed its petition for inquiry on the matter in January of 2009. Mr. Nogales requested that Commissioner Copps support opening a docket to examine the extent and effects of hate speech in media and to seek non-regulatory ways to counteract its negative impacts.

Mr. Nogales also briefly described NHMC’s Memorandum of Understanding, signed with Comcast and NBC-Universal on June 25, 2010. He explained that the MOU will bring significant diversity efforts to Comcast when and if it goes into effect. Mr. Nogales urged that if the FCC approves the merger, it should require that enforcement of the MOU be a condition of the merger approval.

Second, on September 16, 2010, Alex Nogales, Jessica Gonzalez and Tatiana Arizaga from NHMC met with Commissioner Mignon Clyburn and her Acting Chief of Staff, Angela Kronenberg.

Again, Mr. Nogales expressed concern about hate speech in media and its correlation to hate crimes against Latinos; he explained how hate speech and hate crimes against Latinos have intensified since NHMC filed its petition for inquiry on the matter in 2009. Mr. Nogales requested support for opening a docket to examine the extent and effects of hate speech in media and to seek non-regulatory ways to counteract its negative impacts.

Mr. Nogales also described NHMC's Memorandum of Understanding, signed with Comcast and NBC-Universal on June 25, 2010. He explained how the MOU will diversify Comcast. Mr. Nogales urged that if the FCC approves the merger, it should require that enforcement of the MOU should be a condition of the merger approval.

Next, Mr. Nogales reiterated NHMC's position on network neutrality, as articulated in NHMC's comments and reply comments filed in the docket. Ms. Gonzalez announced that NHMC has joined the newly-formed Latinos for Internet Freedom, a coalition of approximately forty Latino-led and Latino-serving organizations dedicated to open Internet rules (for more information on Latinos for Internet Freedom please see <http://www.latinonetlibre.com/home>).

Finally, Ms. Gonzalez described NHMC's request that the Media Bureau reinstate collection of EEO Form 395-B.
