On September 28, 2010, Jim Coltharp, Chief Policy Advisor for FCC & Regulatory Policy at Comcast Corporation, Charlie Kennamer, Vice President, Engineering Policy and Industry Affairs at Comcast Cable, and the undersigned met with Rosemary Harold, Legal Advisor to Commissioner McDowell, to discuss issues in the Commission's CableCARD Further Notice of Proposed Rulemaking ("FNPRM").

Comcast reiterated its strong support for the proposal in the FNPRM to exempt one-way navigation devices from the integration ban, as well as its general support for several other proposals in the FNPRM. Comcast also urged that the Commission provide cable operators with flexibility regarding the interfaces on their high-definition set-top boxes; discussed issues relating to the Tuning Adapter, including industry efforts to modify the Tuning Adapter specification to support four video streams; and expressed its views on various billing and pricing proposals that have been made in this proceeding. In addition, Comcast touched on issues relating to CableLabs' testing and licensing of CableCARD-enabled devices. The discussions were consistent with positions that Comcast has taken previously in its filings in the FNPRM.
