REQUEST FOR EXTENSION

Wyoming.com (“Wyoming.com”) respectfully requests a fifteen-day extension of time to October 16, 2010 to complete and file the Form 477 due September 1, 2010.

Wyoming.com hereby acknowledges the importance of the information being requested by the FCC in the Form 477 as well as the need to have this information in timely manner. However, the information being requested in the revised Form 477, and the related information gathering process, represents a significant departure from previous requirements. As such, the process of completing the new Form 477 has placed a substantial burden and hardship on Wyoming.com to complete by September 1, 2010 for the following reasons: 1) a significant portion of the information and data required is not currently obtained in the ordinary course of business, 2) being a small provider in a predominantly rural market, the information gathering requirements have necessitated that several personnel abandon existing customer-focused job functions in order to obtain the information and data required for accurate completion of Form 477.

Wyoming.com is a small Internet Service Provider and, through its commonly-owned affiliate Contact Communications, Inc. (“Contact”), a competitive local exchange carrier based in Riverton, Wyoming with approximately 6,500 broadband and 600 VoIP subscribers. The census tract data now required in the new Form 477 is not currently being tracked by Wyoming.com, nor does Wyoming.com currently have an automated system to track the data if it was available information. Wyoming.com does not have the resources available to hire a third-party to easily obtain the census tract data as it pertains to the subscribers. The new Form 477 requirements have required Wyoming.com to devote the time of several employees to assemble the subscriber addresses for geocoding to obtain the census tract information. It is

specifically the geocoding assembly process that is now requiring us to request an additional fifteen-day extension to file. Wyoming.com had submitted a thirty-day extension to file request on August 30, 2010.

Wyoming.com is committed to providing the information required in the Form 477, and continues to devote the employee time to completion of the Form 477 as quickly and accurately as possible. However, given the amount and nature of the information being requested, Wyoming.com does not have the time or resources to accurately complete the Form 477 by September 1, 2010. With the additional fifteen-day extension to file, Wyoming.com believes it can accurately provide all of the requested information, as well as establish the systems and procedures necessary to prepare future Form 477s in a more efficient and timely manner. By granting this extension to Wyoming.com, the Commission would be benefiting the public interest by ensuring that Wyoming.com provides complete and accurate data.

In conclusion, for the foregoing reasons, Wyoming.com requests the Commission grant it a thirty-day extension of time to submit its Form 477 filing, currently due September 1, 2010. If the Form 477 is successfully completed prior to the expiration of the thirty-day extension, it will be submitted promptly at that time.
