Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 29, 2010, Robert Quinn and Jack Zinman, representing AT&T, met with Christine Kurth, Legal Advisor to Commissioner McDowell, to discuss the above-referenced proceedings. Consistent with AT&T's prior filings in those dockets, including the joint letters submitted on February 22 and April 29, 2010, to which AT&T was a signatory, we expressed AT&T's strong opposition to the Commission's proposal to reclassify broadband Internet access as a Title II common carrier service. We explained that such reclassification would be unlawful, would undermine investment in broadband networks and, in all events, would not provide a basis for the extreme net neutrality regulations sought by some parties. Rather than pursue the reclassification proposal, we encouraged the Commission to explore alternative approaches that would enable the Commission to pursue the core goals of the National Broadband Plan.
