Dear Ms. Dortch:

On September 29, 2010, Christopher Guttman-McCabe, Vice President, Regulatory Affairs and Jot Carpenter, Vice President, Government Affairs, CTIA – The Wireless Association® (“CTIA”), met with Angela Giancarlo, Chief of Staff and Senior Legal Advisor to Commissioner Robert McDowell. Consistent with the attached presentation, CTIA discussed the following:

- The wireless industry already provides consumer tools for account management, including text-based alerts, applications, operating systems and websites to monitor use;
- Wireless carriers and app developers are constantly providing additional methods for alerting customers regarding their usage to avoid unexpected charges;
- The FCC should not prescribe – and ultimately limit – carriers’ ability to provide effective consumer account management tools; and
- The FCC must carefully consider the implications and feasibility of “real-time” use alerts similar to those required under EU roaming regulations.
