On October 26, 2010, the Voice on the Net Coalition (VON) represented by Brendan Kasper of Vonage, Paula Boyd and Kevin Minsky of Microsoft, Megan Stull of Google, Amy Wolverton of T-Mobile and Glenn Richards, Executive Director and Counsel for VON, met with James Miller of the Office of Engineering and Technology and Patrick Donovan, Zenji Nakazawa, Tim May, Henning Schulzrinne, David Furth, David Siehl, Tom Beers and Erika Olsen (by phone), of the Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau to discuss issues raised in the above-referenced dockets.

In particular, VON discussed how it proactively worked with industry groups in the development of E911 services for VoIP. VON stated its intention to work with Commission staff in the new VoIP E911 docket. VON noted that certain services and devices may not be technically capable of providing 911, may not be expected by consumers to provide 911, and may be information services or may otherwise be outside of the FCC's jurisdiction to require 911 solutions.
