On November 4, 2010, James W. Cicconi, Senior Executive Vice President External & Legislative Affairs, AT&T Inc., discussed the above-referenced proceedings with Edward P. Lazarus, Chief of Staff to Chairman Genachowski. In particular, Mr. Cicconi discussed the prospects for legislation that would address the issues raised in these proceedings. Mr. Cicconi also urged the Commission to explore alternative methods by which the Commission can ensure Internet openness while it pursues the goals of the National Broadband Plan.
