Dear Ms. Dortch:

On Thursday, November 4, 2010, James Monroe III, Chairman of the Board for Globalstar, Inc. ("Globalstar"), met with Paul de Sa, Chief of the Federal Communications Commission's Office of Strategic Planning and Policy Analysis.

At this meeting, Mr. Monroe and Mr. de Sa discussed issues raised in Globalstar's comments on the above-captioned Notice of Inquiry. Mr. Monroe urged the Commission to move forward with a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in this proceeding as expeditiously as possible. He pointed out that there are *100 MHz* of spectrum in the MSS bands that can be used for terrestrial broadband operations, including Globalstar's nearly 20 MHz allotment of terrestrial use spectrum in the Big LEO band. In contrast to other bands, Globalstar's spectrum can be added to the nation's broadband "spectrum inventory" very quickly, without the need for legislation or the relocation of incumbent licensees. Mr. Monroe urged that the Commission take advantage of this unique opportunity and issue its NPRM on MSS-terrestrial flexibility as soon as possible.

Pursuant to section 1.1206(b)(2) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b)(2), this *ex parte* notification is being filed electronically for inclusion in the public record of the above-referenced proceeding.
