On November 17, 2010, Robert W. Quinn, Jr., Senior Vice President-Federal Regulatory and Chief Privacy Officer, AT&T Inc., discussed the above-referenced proceedings with Commissioner Meredith Attwell Baker, Charles Mathias, Senior Legal Advisor-Wireless, International and Public Safety, and Brad Gillen, Legal Advisor-Wireline. In particular, Mr. Quinn discussed the proposed Waxman legislation that would address the issues raised in these proceedings.
