This notice is submitted in compliance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's Rules.

On November 18, 2010, Tyrone Brown and Andrew Jay Schwartzman of the Media Access Project met with Commissioner Copps and Joshua Cinnelli, his Media Advisor.

MAP advocated prompt action in the Commission's Open Internet proceeding. It reiterated positions contained in comments previously filed with the Commission and argued in particular against any approach that did not involve treatment of broadband as a Title II service.

MAP also discussed the pending Comcast/NBCU merger. MAP reiterated that it opposes any grant of the pending applications. MAP took note of rumors that the Commission might consider granting approval with conditions, and argued that no conditions would be sufficient to support a finding that the proposed joint venture would serve the public interest. Among the deficiencies MAP discussed were the power that Comcast/NBCU would have in the broadband market absent strong network neutrality rules backed up by FCC Title II authority and the dangers posed to the nascent over-the-top video market. MAP noted that NBCU's non-compliance with the divestiture requirement for KWHY-TV was especially egregious and that Comcast's promises do not substitute for meaningful minority participation in ownership and program planning. MAP also pointed to the ineffectiveness of conditions unless they were in place through the license renewal cycle which begins in 2119.
