On November 19 and 21, 2010, James W. Cicconi, Senior Executive Vice President External & Legislative Affairs, AT&T Inc., discussed the above-referenced proceedings with Edward Lazarus, Chairman Genachowski's Chief of Staff. In particular, Mr. Cicconi discussed the merits of the proposed Waxman legislation and why it should be a model for a substantive resolution of the issues raised in these proceedings. Mr. Cicconi also urged the Commission to explore alternative methods by which the Commission can ensure Internet openness while it pursues the goals of the National Broadband Plan. Mr. Cicconi's statements were consistent with AT&T's prior submissions in these proceedings.<sup>1</sup>
