Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 8, 2010, James W. Cicconi, Senior Executive Vice President External & Legislative Affairs, AT&T Inc., discussed the above-referenced proceedings with Commissioner Baker. Mr. Cicconi emphasized that the Commission's broadband policies should be designed to foster investment and innovation in next-generation broadband networks and services. Accordingly, Mr. Cicconi urged the Commission not to adopt any regulations that inhibit such investment and innovation, including regulations that exceed the scope of net neutrality legislation proposed earlier this year.¹ Mr. Cicconi's statements were consistent with AT&T's prior submissions in these proceedings.²
