This notice is submitted in compliance with Section 1.1206 (b) of the Commission's Rules.

On December 12, 2010, Dr. Mark Cooper, Director of Research of the Consumer Federation of America, had a phone conversation with Eddie Lazarus, Chief of Staff to Chairman Genachowski.

- He stressed the importance of moving a network neutrality item at the December 21, 2010 open meeting.
- He identified ways in which the rule and order could be improved including a tighter definition of broadband Internet access services, clear principles for defining when network management practices are reasonable and when specialized services would be allowed.
- He also discussed how broadband wireless services could be reached under a well-articulated Title I ancillary authority theory.
- Finally he discussed the relative merits of Title I and Title II approaches.
