Korea and Japan, charging more for the faster speeds (the technology for which already exists but is being withheld) that would save time, create more jobs and grow the economy. Higher prices for higher speeds will squelch much of that growth. The internet is the last frontier in which the public can set up shop, manage their work and be their own bosses, communicate freely around the globe and be exposed to information that traditional media restricts or ignores.
