Re: *Preserving the Open Internet*, GN Docket No. 09-191

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 14, 2010, Robert Quinn and Hank Hultquist, on behalf of AT&T Inc., met with Commissioner Mignon Clyburn and her legal advisors, Dave Grimaldi, Angela Kronenberg and Louis Peraertz, to discuss the above-referenced proceeding. At the meeting, AT&T emphasized that the Commission's broadband policies should be designed to foster investment and innovation in next-generation broadband networks and services. In particular, we urged the Commission to reject calls to either ban, or create a presumption against, arrangements for "paid prioritization."¹ We also urged the Commission not to adopt any regulations that inhibit investment and innovation in wireless broadband Internet access services, including regulations that exceed the scope of net neutrality legislation proposed earlier this year. Our statements were consistent with AT&T's prior submissions in this proceeding.²
