Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 14, 2010, Kathleen Q. Abernathy, Chief Legal Officer and Executive Vice President, Regulatory and Government Affairs for Frontier Communications, and the undersigned met with Commissioner Michael J. Copps, John Giusti, Chief of Staff and Legal Advisor for Wireless, Public Safety and International to Commissioner Copps, and Margaret McCarthy, Policy Advisor, Wireline, to Commissioner Copps.

Ms. Abernathy emphasized that Frontier does not believe that the proposed Internet regulation is needed at this time but should the Commission decide to take action in these dockets, it is critical that the Commission ensures that any broadband regulation is applied in a technology-neutral manner. Ms. Abernathy's statements were consistent with Frontier's prior submission in this proceeding.<sup>1</sup> The participants also provided a handout (attached) and discussed wireless broadband providers' stated intentions to compete with wireline broadband providers.
