Dear Ms. Dortch:

On December 17 and 18, 2010, Kathy Zachem, Vice President, Regulatory and State Legislative Affairs, Comcast Corporation; Rick Cotton, Executive Vice President and General Counsel, NBC Universal, Inc.; Arthur Burke, Davis Polk & Wardwell LLP; David Murray, Willkie Farr & Gallagher LLP (Mr. Murray attended only the December 18 meeting); and the undersigned (collectively, "Applicants") met with Austin Schlick, General Counsel, and John Flynn, Senior Counsel to the Chairman for Transactions. Also present from the Antitrust Division of the Department of Justice were Joseph Matelis, Counsel to the Assistant Attorney General; John Read, Litigation III Section; and Yvette Tarlov, Telecommunications and Media Enforcement Section (Ms. Tarlov attended only the December 17 meeting).

At both meetings, Applicants discussed potential conditions currently under consideration by the Commission in the following areas: the distribution of online video, Hulu, independent programming, the provision of broadband Internet services, and set-top boxes. Applicants reiterated that there is no basis in the factual, legal, or economic record for conditions in these areas. Applicants also described the negative consequences that conditions in these areas could have on competition, consumers, and the Comcast and NBC Universal businesses. Applicants argued that, should the Commission decide to adopt conditions in any of these areas, such conditions should be limited in scope and duration. Applicants also underscored the voluntary commitments they have made on the record in this proceeding and the ways in which those commitments benefit the public interest.
