Dear Ms. Dortch:

On January 25, 2011, Dr. John Tracy, Senior Vice President Engineering, Operations and Technology of The Boeing Company met with Julius Knapp, Chief of the Office of Engineering and Technology (“OET”) to discuss a range of issues. Included in the topics that were discussed was Boeing’s position on the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (“NPRM”) that was adopted in the above-referenced dockets. Also participating in the meeting on behalf of the OET were Ira Keltz, Ronald Repasi, Alan Stillwell, Bruce Romano, Walter Johnston, Jamison Prime, James Burtle, John Kennedy, Anthony Ansongive and Mai Tran. Also participating in the meeting on behalf of Boeing were Audrey Allison, Director Frequency Management Services and Frank Weaver, Director, Telecommunications Policy.

During the discussion, the Boeing representatives expressed support for the overall goals identified in the Experimental Licensing NPRM. It was noted that Boeing is a heavy user of the Commission’s experimental license process to support innovation and testing on new products and technologies. The Boeing representatives expressed general support for the creation of two new classes of experimental licenses. It was requested, however, that the new Program experimental licenses not be limited to the academic community given the vast amount of wireless experimentation that takes place outside the academic field. In addition, given the potentially unlimited number of Innovation Zone experimental licenses that could be issued, such authorizations should be permitted within the confines of exclusive-use facilities such as manufacturing plants. Finally, the Boeing representatives urged the Commission to impose coordination requirements on experimental licensees only when absolutely necessary to avoid harmful interference.
