Notice of Ex Parte Presentation

Dear Ms. Dortch:

Yesterday, Michael F. Mies, Walter M. Zirkle, Richard Emerson, George Calhoun and the undersigned, all representing Main Street Broadband LLC and MSB Spectrum Holdings Inc. (collectively, “the Main Street Representatives”), met with John Giusti of Commissioner Michael J. Copps’ office and, in a separate meeting, with Blaise Scinto, John Schauble and Nancy Zaczek of the Commission’s Wireless Telecommunications Bureau.


The Main Street Representatives discussed their ongoing efforts and activities to provide broadband service to rural Georgia, Florida and Alabama through the lease of spectrum licensed to Educational Broadband Service (“EBS”) licensees. The Main Street Representatives explained that access to EBS “white space” located adjacent to and near its existing service areas would enable Main Street to expand broadband service to rural, unserved and underserved areas. The Main Street Representatives distributed the attached map showing the EBS white space spectrum in southern Georgia and northern Florida.

The Main Street Representatives stated their support for the EBS “white space” licensing rules proposed by the National EBS Association (“NEBSA”) in its Comments filed on September 22, 2008. In particular, the Main Street Representatives indicated that the public interest would best be served if incumbent EBS licensees were afforded the opportunity to expand their Geographic Service Areas (“GSAs”) before the Commission accepts any new applications for remaining white spaces. The Main Street Representatives explained that certain areas might never receive service unless they were included within the GSA of an existing station. Moreover, expanding the GSAs of EBS licenses that already lease their spectrum to Main Street would facilitate Main Street’s

ability to expeditiously serve rural communities for which the Rural Utilities Service has provide funding.
