Yesterday, Bob Quinn and I on behalf of AT&T spoke by telephone with Josh Gottheimer, Senior Counselor to Chairman Genachowski, and Zac Katz, Legal Advisor to Chairman Genachowski. In discussing the above-referenced proceedings we emphasized AT&T's commitment to working cooperatively with the Commission, industry, and other interested parties to achieve a consensus approach to overhauling legacy universal service and intercarrier compensation policies. The transition to universal service policies designed to achieve ubiquitous broadband availability and adoption should be completed in a way that avoids needless disruption and enables the eventual and inevitable sunset of legacy networks and services.
